CALL FOR PROPOSALS

The Florida College Reading Council (FCRC) will be held April 8-9, at the Hampton Inn, Daytona Beach, FL. The conference organizers are soliciting proposals for sessions that demonstrate innovative techniques and strategies that enhance, engage and promote excellence in the learning environment for adult students in reading. These activities may include collaborative discipline teaching and support enhancements, i.e. library. Interactive sessions addressing these areas are strongly encouraged.

The proposals must be formatted as one of the following:

- Lecture: 45-minute session led by one or more presenters, each addressing the audience independently
- Panel discussion: 60-minute session with main presenter serving as a moderator interacting with co-presenter panelists
- Poster: 45-minute sessions in open environments with presenters interacting informally with attendees who visit their stations
- Demonstration: 30-minute formal presentation with a seated audience
- Hands-on workshop: 45-minute focused hands-on session limited to a maximum of 25 participants

GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSION

Proposals that are incomplete and/or do not conform to the following guidelines may be rejected without review.

A summary of the proposed activity must be submitted as a single Word or a RTF file. The summary must be no more than 1000 words. The summary should not contain any obvious indicators that would identify the author(s) of the proposal. The summary must present specific information based on the type of proposal being submitted and detailed following in the order specified and as applicable: a. purpose; b. methods and/or techniques; c. educational importance of the study; and d. interest/connection to FCRC audience. Submitters are encouraged to address the conference theme in one or more of the previous sections.
